




How to Deal with Anger











Matthew 5

²¹ "You have heard that it was said to the people long ago, 'You shall not murder, and anyone who murders will be subject to judgment.'

²² But I tell you that anyone who is angry with a brother or sister will be subject to judgment.

Again, anyone who says to a brother or sister, 'Raca,' (a word used for apostates) is answerable to the court. And anyone who says, 'You fool!' will be in danger of the fire of hell. *

In the revengeful thought the evil deed lies enfolded, as the plant in the seed.



How To Effectively Resolve Conflict:

- Take care of your spouse
- Identify the problem, pray about it, and offer a solution
- · Do not try to agree on what happened
- · Take breaks and calm down
- Go back and talk about the situation so that it is not repeated if possible
- Pray together
- Make sure to resolve the conversation
- Avoid personal attacks that belittle your spouse
- Try not to jump into defensiveness
- Resist the temptation to shut down and stop participating in the conversation

4 things that can cause your relationship to end.

- 1. Indifference
 - 2. Neglect
 - 3. Contempt
 - 4. Violence







1. Realize the cost of uncontrolled anger

- Keep quiet.



















EVERYONE SHOULD BE QUICK TO LISTEN, SLOW TO SPEAK, AND SLOW TO ANGER,
